IN PLACE: Must be in place on Thursday, September 25, 2008 at 12:00 noon. May begin arriving on Wednesday, September 24, 2008 after 12:00 noon.

JUDGING: Sunday, September 28, 2008 at 3:00 p.m.

RELEASED: Staged Release on Sunday, September 28, 2008.

ENTRY DEADLINE: August 29, 2008. Open Show entries may be submitted online or mailed in on an official entry form. Entries submitted online will be accepted until 12:00 midnight on August 29. Entries mailed must be postmarked by August 29.

ENTRY EXTENSION: Entries received prior to August 29, 2008, are able to add additional animals at double the head fees until **September 12, 2008.**

LATE ENTRIES: Entries not received prior to August 29, 2008, can enter until **September 12, 2008,** for triple the head fees.

SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitutions of animals will be accepted until 12:00 noon the day preceding the show for \$15.00. Change in ownership is not a substitution.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Superintendent must finalize their show information by noon the day preceding their show. No changes will be made after this time.

1. The Maine-Anjou division is open to cattle recorded in the herdbook of the Maine-Anjou Association, 760 Livestock Exchange Bldg., Kansas City, Missouri 64102. The Oklahoma Maine-Anjou Association will pay 20% of the liability premiums. All premiums will be paid by the Tulsa State Fair.
2. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the American Maine-Anjou Association. When an exhibitor enters he/she is agreeing to abide with the rules and regulations established by the AMAA as well as the rules of the show management. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation or not abiding by the show rules will be disqualified from showing.
3. All animals must be registered in the AMAA and the original certificate or an application for registration (signed, with a check for fee) are required for presentation before the show. All animals must be 75% Maine-Anjou, or greater.
4. Tattoos will be checked, must be legible, and correspond exactly with the registration certificate or application for registration. Other than Brucellosis Calftlood tattoo, there shall be no other permanent identification marks other than those noted on the certificate of registry.
5. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
6. The use of false tailheads or adding hair, or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
7. The dyeing or artificial changing of the existing color pattern or color is prohibited. Coloring agents to match animal's color may be used on the legs and tail switches, but none may be used above the flank.
8. All animals over 7 months of age must be dehorned.
9. All cattle shall be made available for veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering. Cattle also will be made available for a veterinary examination to be mouthed for purpose of age verification. The Show Committee reserves the right, after mouthing by a qualified veterinarian, to remove the animal from the show or designate the animal to be shown in a different class from that previously entered, at the committee's discretion. An animal shall remain in the same class as placed in at time of mouthing for all future shows. The exhibitor shall have the opportunity to have animal(s) remouthed at his own expense for future shows. The selection of the individual to do the remouthing shall be at the discretion of the AMAA Show Committee.
10. Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian available for inspection.
11. Bulls exhibited at 20 months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
12. Bulls six months of age and older shall be shown with a bull lead in place.
13. Exhibitors shall wear show harnesses to exhibit entry numbers for all AMAA sponsored shows.
14. It is strongly suggested that exhibitors wear the official colors (grey and/or red) during all shows.

The determination of the Show Committee will be final. A banner and pennant will be awarded the Champion and Reserve Champion Cow and Calf .

Three head, both sexes represented. All three head to have same breeder name on individual registration certificates.
50. Produce-of-Dam (Premium A)
Two animals of the same dam. Dam information to be supplied on entry into class.
51. Get-of-Sire (Premium A)
Three head, both sexes represented, sired by one sire, any age.
52. Best Four Head (Premium A)
Any age, owned or co-owned by one exhibitor
